The MBL is a leading international, independent, nonprofit institution dedicated to discovery and to improving the human condition through creative research and education in the biological, biomedical and environmental sciences. Founded in 1888 as the Marine Biological Laboratory, the MBL is the oldest private marine laboratory in the Western Hemisphere.

The MBL has a staff of more than 250 scientists and support personnel working in such fields as cell and developmental biology, ecosystems ecology, microbiology, molecular evolution, global infectious disease, neurobiology, and sensory physiology. Each summer, an additional 1400 scientists and advanced students from the world's most prestigious universities come to the MBL to teach, study, or do basic biological research, many using the diverse and abundant marine organisms found in local waters.

The laboratory's extensive educational program, which consists of a joint Ph.D. program with Brown University, six major summer courses, approximately one dozen special topics courses offered throughout the year, and an undergraduate semester program in environmental science, plays a significant role in training the world's experimental biologists.

The Village of Woods Hole

The MBL is one of seven research and educational institutions in the village of Woods Hole, Massachusetts. The MBL, together with the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, the National Marine Fisheries Service, Sea Education Association, the Woods Hole Research Center, the U.S. Geological Survey, and the J. Erik Jonsson Center of the National Academy of Sciences, makes the village of Woods Hole a world center for biological and oceanographic research.

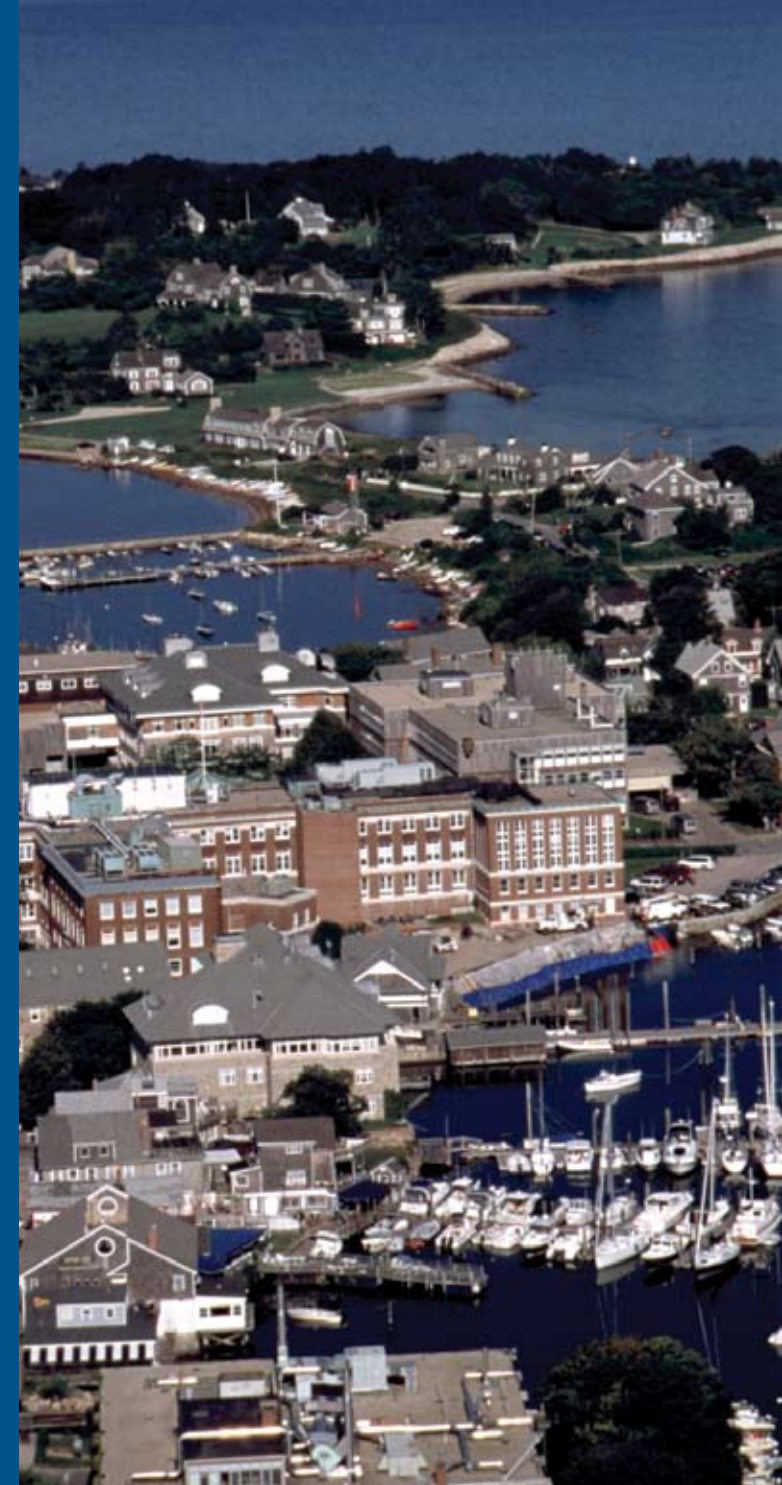
